Market Goat Sale Information:

Sellers Information: If you would like to consign market goats to the 2014 April Fools Sale, the consignment contract can be downloaded from <http://www.cascadeboer.org> website or contact Leslie Bader-Robinson bader1@yahoo.com. There is no fee to sell or buy animals through this sale, but there are requirements for health, quality, and quantity of animals allowed to be consigned. So please read the packet carefully before consigning.

Buyers Information:

Before Arrival: Please check with your LOCAL county fair rules BEFORE purchasing a market goat. Determine if there are age, birth date, sex, disbudding, and/or weight limits (min. and max.).

Previewing: Animals may be viewed in our online sale catalog as they are consigned. Live viewing available at the show Saturday morning in marked sale pens. Sale animals will be clearly identified. Please do not enter pens without owner permission. Sale management cannot guarantee that particular animals in the sale catalog will be at the sale or their time of arrival on the fairgrounds.

Purchasing: The sale this year will be a straight forward pen sale between seller and buyer. Once you have made your selection buyers will contact seller and exchange funds and health certificates. There will be no lottery this year. First come first served, so it is advantageous to get to the show as early as possible to select your market project.

In the Ring: Market goats purchased at April Fools Sale will be eligible for entry into the afternoon prospect market classes. Entry fee is \$5.00 and the class begins at 2:00 pm after percentage does show.

Sale Start: The sale will be ongoing from 12:00 pm through the afternoon on Saturday March 29th. At seller discretion some animals may be available through the weekend.

Price: The price is set at either \$125, \$150, \$175, or \$200 at owner's discretion for all animals in the sale (prices will be marked). This amount is to be paid directly to the seller. In return you will receive the animal and a receipt that includes health information and a COOL form for either Washington or Oregon.

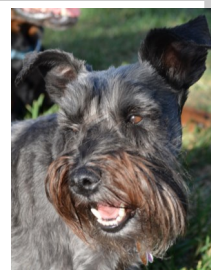
Animals: Premier breeders from across Washington and Oregon will have top quality disbudded and horned market animals in the sale. Both doelings and wethers will be available. Due to the varying rules for 4-H in counties across the northwest, we will have market animals available with birthdates from December 2013 through February 2014. Birthdates will be clearly marked and health records available on each animal; it is the responsibility of the breeder to report these details accurately and the responsibility of the buyer to purchase animals conforming to their local 4-H or FFA rules. Unweaned animals will be identified on their tags and you will need to arrange with the breeder to pick it up at weaning time. All other animals will go home with the buyer from the sale.
