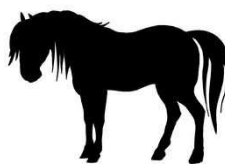

### Mandatory, Pre-Fair Market Animal Weigh-In



Remember, all market lambs, pigs, and goats must attend the upcoming weigh-in on Thu, May 30. Sheep and Swine weigh from 4 pm to 7 pm. Goats weigh from 5 pm to 7 pm. This is not optional, if your animal is to be in a market class, it must be present at weigh in. If you can't bring it, make arrangements for someone else to bring it.

*On a similar note...*

There will be a shearer on hand beginning at 3 pm.

*AND...*

Be smart and keep all your animals safe.... Keep loading and hauling as low stress as possible. Use the bleach near the scales to spray scales before unloading your animals. If you have space available, separate animals that go to weigh-in from production animals that stay home for 7-10 days.

If your market animal is showing signs of illness—contact Candi before bringing it to weigh-in

**SCHEDULE**

**ARRIVAL:** After 3 pm on Friday, May 31st.  
**PERFORMANCE:** On Saturday, all classes will run in numerical order except trail.  
**TRAIL:** Trail will open following showmanship and close at 3 pm on Saturday.  
**RANCH HORSE:** (39-55). These classes will be going on at the same time on Sunday, with age divisions rotating from class to class. All ranch horse classes are expected to conclude by 12 Noon, but could end sooner. **GAMING:** Games will begin immediately following the ranch horse classes on Sunday and run straight through until completion. Approximate start time depends completely on number of entries.  
**CONCESSIONS:** Will be available Saturday and Sunday between 8:30 am and 3 pm (approx)

**Attention NON-4-H Youth Exhibitors:** If you are in the 4th, 5th or 6th grade, you may participate in the JR classes. Seventh, 8th and 9th graders may participate in the INT division and 10th, 11th and 12th graders may participate in the SR division. OPEN division will include anyone 4th grade and older who chooses to ride OPEN.

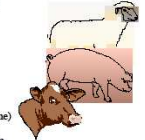
