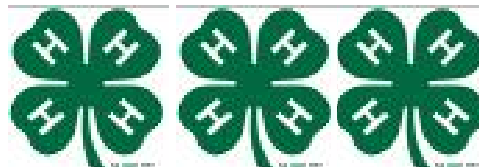

Community Service Opportunity! Days of Caring Project

Cook and serve breakfast at Bethlehem Inn on Saturday, May 14 at 9 a.m.

Bethlehem Inn houses approximately 70 homeless individuals and families. They are in need of breakfast, and it's a unique situation since the Inn is a renovated motel with limited facilities. They have a small kitchen, but food sanitation laws only allow heating food there, no cooking. They do have large warmers for use. Breakfast needs to be made off-site and delivered to their kitchen. Then, a small group of volunteers (5-6) need to serve breakfast since residents are not allowed to serve themselves. It takes about an hour for service. No clean up is necessary, as the Inn will take care of that.

The Inn has a dry pantry and a fridge/freezer that you may shop for ingredients. It's pretty limited, so some items must be purchased. They have two large BBQ's and large stainless steel hotel pans if you want to pick them up in advance to make food in, etc. *(If you wanted to do ground beef and eggs, Candi is happy to provide all the ground beef, at no charge. I have some ham, but probably NOT enough for 70, but you're welcome to whatever I have)*

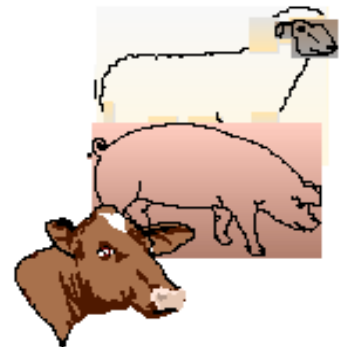

The majority of the basket must be made or produced by the member, it must look presentable, and the member must be able to be present on auction day. ccb

Horse'n Around

Spring Horse Classic 2011

Spring Horse Classic is the state horse knowledge competition. It moves throughout the state to different counties and is a jam packed fun weekend.

Events include Horse Judging, Hippology, Horse Bowl, Public Speaking, Presentations, and Demonstrations. This year Deschutes County was represented by the following teams: Intermediate Horse Bowl, Intermediate Hippology, Intermediate Horse Judging, Intermediate Team Presentation, Senior Hippology, and Senior Horse Judging. 12 youth total from Deschutes County traveled to Roseburg, OR to compete for the weekend!

Hippology teams compete in a variety of ways. To start the competition the team is presented with a problem and given 15 minutes to prepare an answer and present it publicly to the judge and an audience. Team members then individually complete a written test. The final portion of the Hippology contest is horse judging. This year youth were asked to judge 2 performance classes, and 2 conformation classes.

Horse Judging this year was officiated by Judge Doug Evenson. In the Horse Judging contest members individually judge each class, turn in their official placing, and then give 2 or 3 (depending on contestant age) sets of Oral Reasons. The oral reasons are essentially a short public speech defending the placing of the class including specific reasoning. This year's contest consisted of 7 classes and included: Hunt Seat Equitation Over Fences, Norwegian Fjord Mares, Thoroughbred Geldings, Showmanship, Stock Horse Stallions, Western Equitation, and Donkeys.

The Horse Bowl and Speaking contests are run almost identically to our county contests. Small changes in Horse Bowl however include two "Bonus Questions" that are answered together as a team. All of the speaking contestants must present on horse related topics.

Deschutes County has a long standing legacy with excellence at Spring Horse Classic, and this year's teams carried on that tradition proudly! Our Intermediate Hippology Team placed 2nd in the state and included individual achievements like Lauren Walley placing 8th, and Elizabeth Larson placing 5th. Lauren Walley also placed 3rd individually in the

Intermediate Horse Bowl competition. Lauren Curl and Lauren Walley did a Team Presentation on Horse Communication, and Placed 4th in the Intermediate Division. Rosie Skinner placed 13th individually in the Senior Horse Judging Division. All in all, Deschutes County had another VERY successful year.

Our Spring Horse Classic Teams would not have been able to compete at the level they did without the tremendous dedication of their coaches, and the support of local businesses and the Horse Advisory Group! Lynne Shoffner, Anna Shoffner, and Barb Walley deserve a tremendous THANK YOU for all of the LONG hours spent preparing our youth for this event. The teams practiced approximately 2 hours a week for the last 4 months and these coaches were with them every step of the way! THANK YOU! Another big THANK YOU goes to the Deschutes County Horse Advisory committee and Diversified Products of Bend for their monetary donations to the team. The money was used to provide uniforms as well as travel and expense scholarships. We absolutely could not have done it without your support!

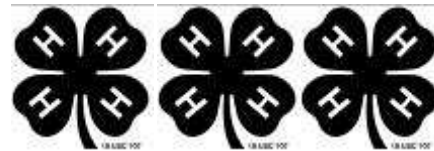
