### 4-H Fees Changing Statewide and Locally

Statewide 4-H Programs have found it necessary to add \$3 per person to the existing \$15 per member charge—making the cost to county, per 4-Her: \$18. In addition to this increase, Deschutes County 4-H also finds it necessary to raise their fee in an effort to not run down our reserves. We had a planned a \$5 per member increase, but given the statewide increase, we'll try to make it with only a \$2 increase. We may have to raise it again next year, but we prefer to make this work. This means \$45 per member next year and \$50 per member after Jan 1.

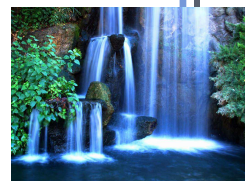
**Scales** are set up and ready to be used during regular fairgrounds hours. PLEASE be respectful—fairgrounds staff need to leave on time (usually around 5:30 unless there is an event going on), be sure you come early enough to leave before they are ready to go. Be sure to clean up after yourself and your animals.



The fairgrounds is usually open around 7 am and usually open on SAT & SUN from 7-4 or so depending on scheduled events. If you need to come in later during a week night, give Candi a call—she is often here and may be able to unlock for you.

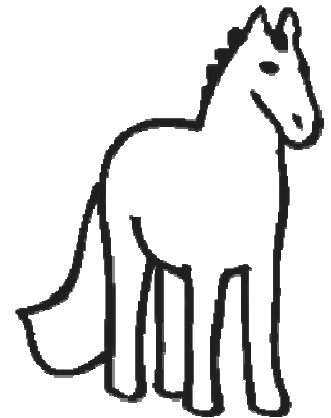

2013 USDF Region 6 Youth Dressage Overnight Camp  
hosted by ODS and DevonWood Equestrian Centre.

We are gearing up for this year's overnight dressage summer camp and it's now time to get your registrations turned in! The USDF Region 6 Youth Dressage Overnight Camp hosted by ODS and held at DevonWood Equestrian Centre will be held from August 5 - 8.



**TO ANSWER A FEW FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:**

The minimum age limit for the camp is 8 and the maximum age limit is 21

We are currently able to accept 60 riders to the camp; registration is open now and **will close on July 1<sup>st</sup>** or when we reach 60 riders.

Participants will be required to stay overnight at DevonWood Equestrian Centre from when they arrive at DevonWood on Monday until their departure on Thursday

The price of the camp will be \$325; this price includes food, stabling, covers the cost of hiring a licensed EMT to handle First Aid, and several other necessary expenditures to ensure that the camp is a safe and comfortable environment for all those in attendance! It also includes a \$25 contribution per camper for the Region 6 NAJYRC Team's expenses. There are a limited number of need based scholarships available.

New for 2013: Wilco and Dry Den Horse Stall Pellets have signed on to sponsor this camp and as a result, initial bedding will be included in the registration fee this year. Additional bedding may be purchased.

This year's camp is coordinated so that it ends at the same time riders will be moving in for this year's Region 6 Junior/Young Rider Team Championship Show; riders staying over for the show will have the added benefit of onsite training prior to this fun competition!

**INSTRUCTORS:**

In an effort to minimize the costs of attending this camp, all of the instructors and lecturers have generously donated their travel fees, time for the weekend and are being housed by friends of the camp. Additionally, DevonWood Equestrian Centre has also deeply discounted the use of their facility and staff for the weekend.

**REGISTRATION:**

In an effort to conserve paper, the registration process will be done mostly electronically. Registration for this camp will be first come first serve. The camp will open for registration at midnight on June 1<sup>st</sup> and the closing date will be July 1<sup>st</sup>. Registration is at [www.dressagecamp.com](http://www.dressagecamp.com). After you submit the registration form and payment, you will receive further instructions regarding liability waivers, and the proof of vaccination. As we get closer to the dates of the camp, the we will also be emailing a suggested packing list, directions, contact information for the on-call vet and farrier.
